HCB Making Good on Chapter House Improvements

Prothers, Epsilon Mu of Delta Tau Delta achieved a huge feat early this year, with the house corporation board paying off all of its debt! We are slowly but surely making headway on some of the chapter house projects we conceptualized long ago. All of these chapter house projects are funded from the approximately \$50,000 per year the HCB now has as a result of being debt free.

We have recently completed a new roof on the 1991 wing, which was over 25 years old, and had new windows installed. The board hopes to have light fixtures updated and the house driveway expanded. We are pleased that though these improvements are long overdue, they will be completed.

Despite coming in short of our fundraising goal for the capital campaign, we are not giving up! The "heated" state of the construction market has our \$1.3 million project quote from five years ago now costing \$2.5-2.9 million. While some of this cannot be attributed to the market, we are still paying a premium price at this point in the market. The board is intent on staying the course in terms of expansion plans for the chapter house. We will not significantly downsize or alter the original design, as doing so will incur considerable additional soft cost expenses and deviate from what several lead donors committed their funds to. The board will continue to solicit the remaining needed funds while putting away money when we can from being debt free and continuing to be fiscally responsible.


